MARC MELLON, BUSTS, STATUES, AND PORTRAIT RELIEFS - ABOUT THE ARTIST

Marc Mellon's works in bronze have served internationally to recognize leadership in a number of fields, including civic affairs, philanthropy, business, medicine, sports, and the arts. Mellon's realistic bronze busts and statues project the qualities of the individual being portrayed, and as such project institutional values for corporations, universities, and medical centers.

His better known portrait bronzes sculpted from life sittings include busts of *Tony Bennett*, sculpted in New York City, *President George H.W. Bush* sculpted in Washington D.C. and his bronze of academy award-winning actress *Patricia Neal*, sculpted in Martha's Vineyard. Mellon's over-life size bust of George Bush is in the permanent collection of the Smithsonian Institution's National Portrait Gallery. A second cast of the George H.W. Bush bust is in the collection of the Central Intelligence Agency in Langley Virginia, and a third was unveiled at the Bush School of Government and Public Service at the Bush Library Center, College Station, Texas.

In 2010 The Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of American History commissioned Mellon to create a bust of major donor Kenneth E. Behring. Mellon's bust of Behring will be unveiled at the museum, at the Kenneth E. Behring Center, in June 2011.

Major public monuments by the artist include a commemorative over life-size statue of **Dr. Alton Ochsner**, for the Ochsner Medical Center in New Orleans. In October of 2009 his 8'bronze statue of **George Eastman** was unveiled on the University of Rochester's historic Eastman Quadrangle.

Over the years Mellon has completed commissioned busts of *Winston Churchill*, *Muhammad Ali, President and Mrs. Lee Teng-hui* of Taiwan, *Theodore Roosevelt*, and *Albert Einstein*. In October 2001 Mellon's over-life size bronze bust of *Pope John Paul II* was unveiled at The Vatican during a Papal Audience in St. Peter Square. The bust honored the Pope for his efforts "in promoting respect, tolerance, and understanding amongst the world's religions." In December 2010 Mellon completed a bust, from life sittings, of Nobel Laureate *Elie Wiesel*.

The artist is also known for his bas relief and medal portraits. In late 2008 Mellon's relief portrait of Barack Obama was chosen by the Presidential Inaugural Committee for the obverse (front) of the 2009 Official Presidential Inaugural Medal. Mellon's over life-size portrait relief of *Helene Simon* is on view at Indiana University, Bloomington, for the campus Hillel Center named in her honor. Satirist Garry Trudeau commissioned Mellon to create a portrait relief of his father, noted physician *Francis Berger Trudeau Jr.*, for the Trudeau Institute in Saranac Lake, NY. Mellon's relief portrait of *President Theodore Roosevelt* for the Theodore Roosevelt Association has been unveiled at historic sites throughout the United States. The artist's medal of President Roosevelt is a coveted award presented annually. Mellon's portrait relief of *Arnold Bernhard*, founder of Value Line Investment, graces the Arnold Bernhard Library at Quinnipiac University in Hamden Connecticut.

The artist is also well known for his bronze figures in motion and balance, works that have been exhibited from New York to Tokyo. Dancers and athletes are amongst his favorite subjects. The dance world's legendary artists *Agnes de Mille* and *Cynthia Gregory* have been honored with Mellon dance bronzes, which have been exhibited from New York to Tokyo and are in numerous private collections. In 2007 he produced his first fountain, for Anderson University in South Carolina, which included the bronze figure Prayerful Dancer.

Mellon is also the sculptor of the NBA MVP and WNBA MVP Trophies, and is well-known in the sports world for realistically capturing movement. Shaquille O'Neal, Michael Jordan, Mickey Mantle, Roger Clemens, Chris Evert, Arthur Ashe, Joe Namath, Tom Seaver, Larry Bird, Lisa Leslie and many others have been honored with Mellon sport bronzes. Realistic full-figure commissions include Drazen Petrovic for the National Basketball Association, Bob Clarke for the Philadelphia Flyers and Boomer Esiason with son Gunnar for the Boomer Esiason Foundation.

High-profile busts for universities across the United States, including a bust of *President Emeritus John Silber* of Boston University, a bust of *William Pitt* for Sacred Heart University, and a bust of *Chancellor Herman B. Wells* for Indiana University.

Mellon divides his time between studios in Redding, Connecticut and Manhattan at the historic National Arts Club. He is married to fellow sculptor Babette Bloch; the artists have two very artistic children. Mellon is an active former President of The Artists' Fellowship Inc., a Foundation assisting professional fine artists during times of emergency, and is a frequent juror for national exhibitions. Active memberships include The National Arts Club, The Salmagundi Club, and The National Sculpture Society. Mellon also serves on the Board of Advisers of The National Museum of American Illustration, and on the Steering Committee of The Portrait Society of America. He was elected to membership in the Century Association in 2007, and elected Fellow in the National Sculpture Society in 2010.

The artist has written and lectured on the subject of "Values and Achievement as Portrayed in Sculpture." In 2005 he was awarded the "Distinguished Achievement Award in the Arts" from the Brooklyn College Alumni Association and is the recipient of awards from The National Sculpture Society, Allied Artists of America, The National Arts Club, The Salmagundi Club and others. He has served on the jury of selection and awards for numerous arts organizations.
